Just call us 'Turnstone'

A message from Executive Director Nancy Louraine.

I'm sure you've noticed the new name and look we've given this, our quarterly newsletter. It's just one of the big changes going on at Turnstone, and I thought this first issue of *Empower* would be a good time to get you up to speed.

As the new title and colors might suggest, we're rebranding. We've changed so much over the years, not just since Turnstone was founded as the Society for Crippled Children in 1943, but also during the more-recent years since we moved to our current location. So we thought it was time to make changes to our image and our message that will better reflect who we are today.

Our programs and services have grown and evolved to include people of all ages—infants to older adults. We now provide early-childhood education for

kids of all abilities, a broad range of therapy, exercise and rehabilitation, early-intervention services, daytime activities for adults, support groups, sports and recreation, equipment loan, residential ramp building, and much more.

Sports is one area in particular in which we've grown by leaps and bounds. Turnstone began offering sports and recreation opportunities in the mid-'90s, but it's been during the last few years that those programs have really taken off. We're now represented by teams and individuals in basketball, soccer, boccia, sled hockey, tennis—the list continues to grow. Our athletes have made a name for themselves, and Turnstone, at the state and national levels. As our sports programs have grown, so has the number of people who know what we're all about.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

And that brings me to our first big rebranding change. From now on, just call us "Turnstone." Although we're still a "center for children and adults with disabilities," we'll be known simply as "Turnstone." We're recognized nationally because of the great success of our sports teams. At that level, and even locally, our entire name is rarely used.

We've also tweaked some of the phrases we use to describe our organization. Our "rallying cry" is now "Creating Possibilities." Our mission statement now reads, "Turnstone provides therapeutic, educational, wellness, and recreational programs to empower people with disabilities."



In addition, we have a new logo. A more abstract way to look at what we do, this logo brings to mind a wheel that perpetually creates possibilities. We adopted the turnstone, an industrious little shorebird, as our logo in 1989. The turnstone is relentless in its search for food, lifting heavy stones with just its beak. The turnstone was perfect for us, but the truth is that many people didn't make the connection. But don't worry; the turnstone hasn't flown our coop. We're using an updated, fiercer image of the turnstone as the logo for the Turnstone Flyers, our sports teams.

A LITTLE BIRDIE ALSO TOLD US ...

We didn't just go off willy-nilly in our rebranding plans. We asked our constituents, and, then, we listened. More than 200 clients and their families

responded to our recent survey. We also consulted our "branding champions," members of the board, staff, and our dedicated volunteers.

The responses to our survey left us both humbled and proud. Three words resonated in those responses: "empower," "community," and "wellness." Our clients see Turnstone as a community, a family, a place where they come for therapeutic experiences that foster their confidence and independence.

Rebranding is the process of changing perceptions, of repositioning yourself in the marketplace. For us, it's also a facelift of sorts, bringing a fresher, more up-to-date look. However, the most exciting upcoming change at Turnstone is more concrete.

Because of the growth of our programs and the increasing number of people we serve, we've run out of space. The most pressing concern is that there continues to be a long waiting list for pediatric therapy. We need more staff in this area, but we can't hire anyone until we have enough room for them to work.

To meet that challenge, our board of directors has approved a 10,000-square-foot expansion to the Dr. Robert Kimbrough Early Learning Center. We plan to begin construction in August, and six months later, move in, begin to add new staff, and treat more children.

We're going to use this new space to create a state-of-the-art pediatric-therapy center with individual therapy rooms,

specialized equipment, and a large area to promote gross motor skills. It will be a place for therapy, a place to get work done. But it will also be a bright, colorful, child-oriented place.

This expansion is being made possible by very generous contributions from the Ian and Mimi Rolland Foundation, Madge Rothschild Foundation, English Bonter Mitchell Foundation, and McMillen Foundation.

A BEAUTIFUL DAY IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

There's also going to be another change in our neighborhood. Through a bequest left to us in 2010, we've purchased the two-acre parcel that adjoins our property to the north. We're going to remove the existing structures, clean up the area, and improve the entrance that will give us greater visibility along North Clinton Street.

In another new program here, we're reaching out to veterans organizations to see what we can do to promote the wellness, fitness, and rehabilitation of veterans with disabilities. We want to do more for the men and women who have made such great sacrifices for our country.

Well, that's the gist of what's happening here, but stay tuned. We're halfway through our five-year plan, and we're right on track. We're looking forward to the next couple of years with great anticipation and excitement.

I often think about Dr. Robert Kimbrough, the namesake of our early-learning center. As an orthopedic surgeon, he enhanced the lives of countless people. He took that to an even higher level through his absolute dedication to our organization and to our clients. I'm sure that Dr. Kimbrough would be so proud of how far we've come and where we're headed.

There are some big changes afoot here for sure, but one thing will never change—our absolute dedication to empowering and promoting the wellness, dignity, and independence of our clients.

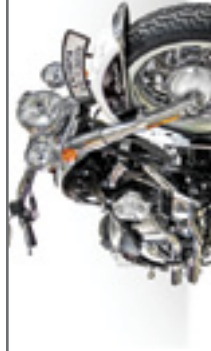
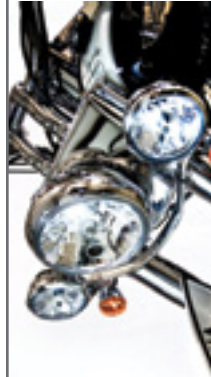
